Ideas to try at home



Family reward system for showing kindness at home.

Display good pieces of work, certificates, achievements on a wall, fridge or cupboard.

Have photos up at home showing things that different members of the family enjoy and are good at.

Comment and question the emotions of characters whilst reading books together.

Model giving compliments to each other at home

Use timers or music to signal tidy up time.

Play turn taking games e.g. card games, board games.

Display a bank of kind words and positive quotes on the wall at home.

Come up with a list of house rules together. e.g.. Be kind, Be safe, Be ready.

Label toy boxes so children know where to put their toys when they have finished.

Have a calendar on the wall so everyone knows what is happening and on what days.

Use scenarios and scripts to teach difference and acceptance

e.g. 'Everyone is different, but all are welcome.' 'A goldfish wouldn't be expected to climb a tree.'

'Fair isn't everyone getting the same thing, fair is everyone getting what they need to be successful'
